Integrate will provide a program that is engaging, challenging and stimulating to the senses and intellect, extending the physical and cognitive capacities of consumers led by individual need, goals and interests in order to achieve goals

Integrate currently offers a variety of weekly workshop during term time.

Leisure-includes hobbies and interests, dining out, volunteering, involvement in community activities, gardening, attending sporting events, the movies, concerts or art galleries.

Work skills development and Adult learning opportunities-

support is provided to ensure that appropriate training can be accessed, using support workers to attend groups of interest and work with mentors or volunteers

Recreation-is a positive and life enhancing activity that enables development in a wide range of options including sport events, team groups or as an individual.

Individual Support-is available, for people with individual needs.

Community Art-Focus offers opportunities to participate in community art projects within the local East region.

Life skills development-assist consumers to further develop skills and competencies that enable community participation.
